Every student as a nember of one of the three resident classes, is elifible to vote. 'The election will bf for next year's President and Vice President.

In addition, on that day e will vote on severs proposed anendments to the Student Association constitntion and by-laws. Since I will be out of town on that day I wowld like to explain the reasonin for this action.

First, as anyone knows, the constitution needs a rener al up-dating. There is need to change the section that makes the agenda due to be nosted for a meeting, only two doys before the Association. Dues are voted on in the fall ( after $t h e$ Business Office bills you ). That needs to be changed to the Spring term. Also the section dealing with the Social Action Conittee requires a member of the \%omen of the Seminary tobe a represent tive to that comittee. Since ve don't have a d.O.T.S. troup and surely this should be chan ;ed to a member of the Tashin ton House of Studies.

Another amendment proposed vouln renuire a menver of each closs and a reshin ton liouse of Studies person o $n$ the Lecture Publioations, and Social Committee (Social Action and the proposed Consortiurn Rel tions Conittee is dealt ith elsewhere in the by-laws).

Perhans the larsest bulk of the anendments deal with the Consortiun Relations Con ittee, which would renlace the Eccumenics Committee. This new comittee as an attempt, to deal with the problems of havine a seminery in two different locations ( there is another ay of doine this by simply saying "to Hell with the othere site" ). Whis committee would facilitate relations between !ashington and Getyysburs and yould make sench site aware of wh is $t$ oins on at the other one. It would consist of ei tht menbers-one student each of the resient classes at Gettysburf and three elected by and from the House of Sturies, plus the director of the $H$ ou se and a Gettysburg faculty member. the chairman would come from the L.. . .
